## Blaze guts an industrial building

An industrial complex on Clark Street went up in flames Thursday afternoon, Jan. 19, destroying three businesses and keeping firefighters and emergency responders occupied late into the night.

Firefighters responded to a structure fire at 200 Clark St. at 12:20 p.m. and found the building in flames.

"It looked like a chimney fire; we saw smoke," said Paul Rodrigues, associate creative director at Signature Advertising. "By the time we got outside we started to see flames shooting out the roofs on both sides."

The building was gutted. Employees had been evacuated by the time firefighters arrived, said Capt. Peter Kurtz, of Southington Fire Department.

Once it became clear that the building was unsalvageable, firefighters

went into defensive mode, dousing the area with water. It took two hours to put the fire out, Kurtz said.

The building was divided into three businesses: Speciality Cleaning & Detailing, an auto detailing business; T. C. & Sons Trucking and a general contractor's office.

Everything was destroyed except for a storage shed in the rear of the building, Kurtz said. Among the casualties were vintage cars that were being restored, two Harley-Davidson motorcycles and a Ford Cobra, he said.

Several propane tanks and acetylene torches exploded while they were battling the fire. Firefighters worked hard

to keep the fire from igniting a 2,000-gallon diesel tank on the premises.

"That would have been an environmental nightmare if it ever let go, but we saved it," Kurtz said. Thirty-three Southington firefighters responded to fight the blaze.

Two firefighters suffered minor injuries. One was taken to an area hospital and was treated and released for scrapes to his hand and back. Another slipped on ice, but declined treatment.

Massive amounts of water were used, which at times caused the water pressure to drop. As the water ran from the scene, it froze, creating icy con-

## Man arrested for dropping gun

Southington Police arrested a Meriden man who lost a loaded handgun near Derynoski School while he was running from police while he was heavily intoxicated.

**Aryan A. Bubier**, 34, of 166 Carter Avenue, Meriden turned himself into police on Jan. 16. He was charged with first degree reckless endangerment and carrying a firearm under the influence.

Bubier was held on a \$5,000 bond for a Jan. 30 court date.

The arrest pertains to a Jan. 8 incident where officers ran into Bubier stumbling around in the down-

town area around 1:45 a.m. Police Spokesman Sgt. Lowell DePalma said patrol officers witnessed Bubier stumbling along the road and sidewalk near Center Street. DePalma said that Bubier bolted when approached by police, ending up in a dead end area, backed with a high chain link fence, near Pizza House and the AT&T buildings.

Bubier waited for the police and told them that he was heavily intoxicated after realizing that he was caught in a dead end.

"He said he was at the bars, had too much to drink and decided to walk home instead," DePalma said.

DePalma said Bubier would eventually go home

with a drunken friend who was walking home himself.

At 8 p.m. that evening Bubier walked into police headquarters and inquired about a handgun that he had lost the prior day. Bubier told police that he had the gun in his waistband and had lost it on his way home from the bars.

Police checked the area and found the gun, a loaded 9mm, lying in a grassy area near the AT&T building. The section of town is a high traffic area and is within 1,500 ft of Derynoski School.

Bubier did have the required permits to carry the firearm, but no permits allow for bringing a gun into a bar.
